



Founded in 2003, Pride Lafayette, Inc, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, continually educates and promotes awareness of diversity, health, culture and acceptance of individuals based on sexual orientation and gender identity. Working with the LGBTQ+ community in Greater Lafayette and north central Indiana, Pride Lafayette, Inc. facilitates and coordinates efforts and programs geared toward diversity education, health initiatives, community mobilization, cultural enhancement, and research. Pride Lafayette seeks to be the premier link to the Greater Lafayette LGBTQ+ community, to build bridges within the community and forge new bonds among young and old, life-long residents and newcomers, and community members living on both sides of the Wabash. We celebrate the strength and diversity of our community, and we foster an increased sense of well-being in the lives we touch.

Pride Lafayette operates the **Pride Lafayette Community Center**, the oldest LGBTQ+ community center in the state of Indiana, located on Main Street in the heart of downtown Lafayette. With the support of community volunteers, the Center offers daily open hours and provides a safe and welcoming space for the LGBTQ+ community, as well as partner organizations and outreach programs including PFLAG, TransLafayette, the Pride Lafayette Youth Group, and HIV Pathways. Working with the Tippecanoe County Health Department and IU Health PositiveLink, the Center also offers regular HIV testing.

Pride Lafayette annually reaches and serves more than 10,000 people in the Greater Lafayette area.

The organization partners with allied organizations within Purdue University, including the University's LGBTQ Center and Purdue Employee Pride, to provide support and resources for students, faculty and staff alike. Pride Lafayette also serves as a resource to local governments, businesses, and community organizations to assist them in making Greater Lafayette a more welcoming and inclusive place for the LGBTQ+ community.

Pride Lafayette is a member of **CenterLink**, the network of LGBTQ+ community centers, which serves to strengthen, support, and connect LGBTQ+ community centers. Pride Lafayette is also a member of **InterPride**, the international association of Pride organizations, the **United States Association of Prides**, which helps to build vibrant and strong US Pride organizations through collaboration, support, networking, providing resources, helping to develop a national identity of Pride, and offering support and advocacy for its members, and the **Indiana Pride Network**, the network of pride celebration organizers in Indiana.

The past year is one for Pride Lafayette's history books.

From its founding, the organization operated with an all-volunteer board of directors overseeing all of our operations and programming. Relying on volunteers, with their own conflicting schedules and families, can prove challenging for any organization, but our board has always juggled their organizational and personal responsibilities to ensure Pride Lafayette continued to thrive.

However, it has always been my goal to grow the organization to the point that we could bring on staff who could help guide the organization, increase our capacity and our programming, and build our outreach to the Greater Lafayette community.

This year we took the first step toward that goal by hiring a part-time executive director on an interim basis. This unanimous decision by the board at the start of 2024 was an investment in our organizational sustainability and future growth. I've been energized by everything we were able to accomplish in the first six months of 2024 (the second half of our fiscal year) and I'm excited about what the future holds.

The 2023-2024 fiscal year (July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024) saw OUTFest 2023 move down Main Street and expand its footprint from its previous location at 5th & Main. (The move also put the Pride Center in the middle of the festival footprint allowing us to easily welcome festival goers into the Center.)

We held an expanded Second Chance Prom at Coyote Crossing Golf Club in April. We saw renewed partnerships with the Purdue LGBTQ Center and Purdue Employee Pride to strengthen and promote our outreach on campus.

In partnership with IU Health PositiveLink, regular HIV testing returned to the Pride Lafayette Community Center. And we worked with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) of West Central Indiana to house their regular LGBTQ+ mental health support group.

I'm especially proud of our new partnership with the American Red Cross to hold regular blood drives at our Community Center. While there are still certain discriminatory regulations in place that prevent some members of the LGBTQ+ community from donating, the rule changes that took place at federal level during the COVID-19 pandemic (and later became permanent) opened the door for LGBTQ+ individuals to donate blood and we're proud to help lead that effort in Greater Lafayette.

To top it all off, we celebrated Pride Lafayette's 21st anniversary on April 23, 2024, and adopted a new logo!

It's been an incredible and exciting 12 months for Pride Lafayette and I look forward to what's next in our journey. Thank you for standing with us and making all of this possible!

In late 2020, I made the move to Lafayette, Indiana after 25 years working just a few miles from the U.S. Capitol in Washington, DC. It didn't take long before I was recruited to join the Pride Lafayette board.

However, if you'd have told me three years ago that I would step in to the role of Pride Lafayette's first executive director, I likely would have laughed. I'm a production manager by training, and a communications and marketing guy by trade. And while my entire career has been based in the non-profit world, it was never a goal of mine to "sit in the hot seat," as it were, as an executive director.

But, the universe has a funny way of steering you toward things, even if you resist.

My brother likes to joke that I've never met a board I didn't want to serve on. There's some truth to that, because I believe we're all charged in our lives with helping to make our individual corner of the universe a little better than we found it. When I see a way that I can be helpful and help clean up another little corner of the universe and make things better for others in the community, I try and step up and help.

So here I stand with a broom and some hammer and nails, ready to help make life a little better for Greater Lafayette's LGBTQ+ community.

The first six months of my tenure has consisted of drinking straight from the fire hose: connecting with CenterLink, Interpride, and the U.S. Association of Prides (and all of the opportunities to learn that come from our membership in those associations); expanding our communications and messaging strategies; identifying new community partnership and grant funding opportunities; and helping implement new programs and support existing ones. (There's also the more mundane side of things like establishing policies and procedures that need to be in place as a guide for future executive directors and, hopefully, future staff.)

All of these things have been challenging and exhilarating. But what I have enjoyed most is making connections with the people who have been eager to step up and help Pride Lafayette fulfill its mission. From our sponsors and community partners to our volunteers and donors, getting to know and work with such amazing people to make Greater Lafayette a better place for the LGBTQ+ community has been an honor.

What you'll read about in these pages is just the start of a multi-year expansion plan to strengthen Pride Lafayette and support the LGBTQ+community in Greater Lafayette. And we're just getting started.

There's never been a more important time for the LGBTQ+ community to be at the top of its game given that the current climate has put the LGBTQ+ community — most especially the members of our trans community — in the political crosshairs in both Indianapolis and Washington, DC.

That Pride Lafayette's expansion is happening at this moment in history is the universe steering us where we need to go. Thank you for joining us on the journey! At its mid-year retreat, the Pride Lafayette board voted to rebrand the organization, replacing the logo that had represented the organization since its founding 2003. The new look honors our long-standing branding. The original rainbow triangle has been incorporated as a pink triangle (see more about the Pink Triangle on page 18). And we've added a new outline of the state of Indiana (to differentiate us from other Lafayettes around the country.)

The flowing spectrum of rainbow colors within the Indiana outline represent the diversity of the queer community that lives and works on both sides of the Wabash River. And "Pride" was made unapologetically bolder and more prominent.

In addition to a new look for Pride Lafayette, the brands for TransLafayette, OUTFest, the Pride Lafayette Youth Group, the Bi/Pan Convo Group, and the #LafayetteProud newsletter were refreshed to create a cohesive look across the organization.

The Pride Lafayette website has been redesigned and refreshed to conform to our new brand standards. The website redesign also included updates to make the site mobile responsive so that it can be easily accessed from any device.

But while our look may have changed a bit, our mission remains the same: providing outreach and support to the LGBTQ+ community of Greater Lafayette and North Central Indiana and working with our community partners to raise awareness about issues impacting Greater Lafayette's queer residents.

Saturday, August 19, 2023 provided the perfect weather to celebrate Pride Lafayette's 20th anniversary at OUTFest 2023. Under the theme "Cheers to 20 Years of Pride Lafayette," an estimated 3,500 folx came together to celebrate the diversity of the Greater Lafayette region.

This year's festival ran down Main Street from 6th to 9th Streets, meaning the festival was back in front of the Pride Center for the first time in many years. OUTFest featured a larger family area, larger beer garden, a new acoustic stage and the Main Stage located under the glow of the Lafayette Theatre marquee.

The day kicked off with its traditional opening ceremonies on the Main Stage featuring the Pride Lafayette Board of Directors, Lafayette Mayor Tony Roswarski, West Lafayette Mayor John Dennis, State Reps. Sheila Klinker and Chris Campbell, and West Lafayette Director of Development Erin Easter.

Two "Spirit of Pride" awards were presented during the ceremonies. The first was given to outgoing Mayor Dennis for his unwavering support of Pride Lafayette and making LGBTQ+ advocacy a hallmark of his administration throughout his tenure. The second was presented to outgoing Pride Lafayette board member Lyndsey Taylor Bird in recognition of her years of dedicated service to the organization.

OUTFest concluded with its annual familiy-friendly drag show hosted by Jessika Savage and Alexis DuCraix, which drew the ire of a right-wing blogger from South Bend who took note that OUTFest and our family-friendly drag show were open to all ages. His keyboard-warrior outrage fueled a few hateful calls to Pride Lafayette and some of our sponsors. Though he was hoping to stir up protesters, ultimately, nothing more came of his outrage.

However, the incident served as a reminder that, while we might enjoy tremendous support locally, the broader LGBTQ+ population of Indiana still faces incredible hatred and discrimination, and it underscored that Pride Lafayette's work is just as important today as it was when we started in 2003.

Every year during the holiday season, Pride Lafayette adopts 10 families throughout Tippecanoe County (and north central Indiana) and provides them with a full holiday meal and, as appropriate, gifts for the holiday season. This year, we renamed our Holiday outreach "Christy's Christmas Carol," in memory of our late board member, Christy Warrig, who died unexpectedly in May 2023.

Wearing her signature cat-ears headbands, Christy spread joy and light wherever she went, even as she struggled with her own loneliness during the holidays — an issue many LGBTQ+ people feel after being ostracized by their families (something Christy herself faced).

We could think of no better way to honor Christy's memory than by spreading joy and light during the holiday season. And, the weekend before Christmas, our elves once again hit the road to deliver our care packages to our adopted families, providing a total of 16 adults and 12 children with a slightly brighter holiday.





In addition to hosting twice-monthly meetings for trans and gender diverse folx in Greater Lafayette, TransLafayette also hosts a very popular board game night at the Pride Center.

In cooperation with Purdue Employee Pride, TransLafayette hosted a potluck and clothing swap for Trans Day of Remembrance in November 2023, which gave rise to the creation of Community Closet and permanent clothing swap at the Center.



In March, Pride Lafayette and TransLafayette joined with the Purdue LGBTQ Center, the Purdue Queer Student Association and the Purdue Student Union Board to celebrate Trans Day of Visibility on campus with a Block Party to celebrate the lives of trans and gender diverse folx. The Block Party featured group activities in the Purdue LGBTQ Center, tabling by community resources, and a drag show — for some in attendance, their first one — hosted by Veronica Foxx.

(In Spring 2023, Pride Lafayette and TransLafayette hosted a first-ever Trans Resource Fair. A second fair was planned for Spring 2024, but logistical issues necessitated a delay to the Fall.)

BECOMING COMMUNITY

The Pride Lafayette Youth Group created and named a new mural that hangs in the Pride Center. Working from an outline of Keith Haring's iconic "Coming Out" imagery, each member took a canvas and painted it as they saw fit. The individual pieces were put back together to create a mural that hangs in the entrance of the Pride Lafayette Community Center on Main Street. The students called the piece, "BEcoming commUnity," and it's a wonderful reminder that we're working for the day when every member of the LGBTQ+ community can be their authentic selves.

Data from the 2022 IYG annual report (formerly Indiana Youth Group) show that 45% of LGBTQ+ young people had seriously considered dying by LGBTQ+ young people reported experiencing discrimination based on their sexual orientation/ gender identity at least once in their lifetime. And just 37% of LGBTQ+ young people identified their home as a safe and affirming space.


The statistics are astounding and demonstrate the need for organizations like the Pride Lafayette Youth Group. Led by co-facilitators (a school counselor and a special education teacher) who work daily with students in the Tippecanoe School Corporation, the Pride Lafayette Youth Group meets once a month on the last Saturday to provide a welcoming space for LGBTQ+ students (and their parents) from across the region.

The group's activities range from social events, like movie screenings and all-family outings to Exploration Acres and Prophetstown State Park to volunteering for events like OUTFest to educational and group discussions on a wide range of topics.



PINK TRIANGLE SOCIETY

Once a symbol of Nazi hatred and intolerance, the Pink Triangle was reclaimed as a symbol of defiance and solidarity during the rise of the queer liberation movement of the 1970s. In the 1980s, it came to symbolize the fight against the AIDS epidemic that claimed so many queer lives. Today, while it is seen "as an empowering symbol, it is ultimately a reminder to never forget the past — and to recognize the persecution LGBTQ+ people still face around the world."

In that spirit, Pride Lafayette has created the Pink Triangle Society as a way to recognize those supporters who dedicate themselves to making sustained monthly contributions to help us fight LGBTQ+ discrimination in north central Indiana while remembering and honoring those around the world who lost their lives because of hate and intolerance.
